

Investigating the Mechanisms of Myalgic Encephalomyelitis: From Pathogenesis and Aetiology to Treatment Innovation

More presenters have been announced for the colloquium.

In light of their recent important research, the charity is delighted to announce the addition to the BRMEC14 programme of Drs. **Maxim N. Artyomov** and **Tomas Paulenda** from

Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri, USA. By revealing how metabolic rewiring (via itaconate) directly modulates redox-sensitive



pathways (PRDX5 inhibition) in immune cells, their work alludes to the synergy between systems biology, immunology, and redox signalling - a framework critical for understanding the complexities of ME.

year - along with numerous abstract and poster presentations from Early career researchers.


